Members were able to get an exclusive look at factory operations and the newly remodeled office space. Two John Deere UAW workers led the group through Seeding's fabrication area, main assembly lines, and row unit line and provided insights on daily operations. Overall, 22 members attended the tour and joined us for dinner at The Riverhouse in Moline.

Winter Meeting Review: This year's Winter Meeting, originally scheduled for January 23rd, was moved to February 6th when St. Ambrose closed their campus on the original date due to weather concerns after a near record snow fall and cold weather earlier in the month. A total of 56 attended with 35 in person and 21 remotely including three students.

The first tech session speaker, <u>Mark Dilts</u>, CNH lead engineer for electric battery tractors, discussed the recently introduced <u>New Holland T4</u> and <u>Farmall 75C</u> electric battery powered tractors. The tractors have an estimated field work time of

approximately four hours before needing recharging. Besides noise and emissions benefits, they can provide ac power for operating hand tools from the tractor.

The speakers for the second tech session presentation were Peter Horne and Ben Peterson, engineers from Vermeer, discussing the ZR5-1200 self-propelled large round baler. An interesting technology feature on this machine are temperature sensors for the most heavily loaded bearings providing an operator warning of potential overheating situations.

Author and photographer Lee Klancher gave the after-dinner presentation based on his recently released history of the Farmall tractor, the <u>Farmall</u> Century.
