Fall Meeting Review - The Fall Meeting was held on October 29th at the CNH Mt. Joy engineering facility with approximately 30 in actual and 10 in virtual attendance. This change in location was made due to the meal and room charges at St. Ambrose becoming higher than the meeting income from the Section's \$ 30 per person meeting charge leading to the Section losing money on its three yearly meetings. So the Section's Executive Committee made the decision to try lower cost locations for the Section meetings. Our thanks to CNH for making their facility available.

The first tech session presentation, <u>Hydrogen Fuel</u> <u>Cell Tractor Powered by Biogenic Hydrogen</u>, was authored by Christian Mayer and given remotely by <u>Stefano Fiorati</u> of CNH. Stefano outlined the many alterations made to a conventional diesel engine powered tractor to accommodate the fuel cell power source. A major challenge in incorporating alternate fuels is the additional fuel storage space required to provide equivalent field operating times to a diesel engine powered tractor.

In the second tech session also given remotely, <u>Corey Spaetti</u>, Chief Operating Officer for Sabanto described the <u>Sabanto Steward Autonomous Tractor</u> <u>Upgrade</u> which provides a hardware and software kit to enable autonomous operation on existing tractors. Besides providing for autonomous in-field operation, the Sabanto Steward system has capability for autonomously moving between fields.

After dinner, the Section welcomed ASABE President <u>Doug Otto</u> who described several recent Society initiatives. He suggested long time members reconnect with a technical committee they previously belonged to, engage with a new group and become an advocate for ASABE by telling others what the Society has done for you..

The after dinner presentation was given by <u>Paul</u> <u>Yeager</u>, host of the Iowa PBS produced <u>Market to</u> <u>Market</u> program shown locally on Friday evenings.
