Winter Meeting Review: Maintaining the change from discontinuing meeting at St. Ambrose to lower meeting costs, this year's Winter Meeting, held on January 28th, was held at the Deere & Company Moline Technology and Innovation Center with approximately 35 in attendance including three St. Ambrose University students.

The first tech session speaker, <u>Ron Schroeder</u>, a John Deere Harvester product engineer, spoke on his experience in developing and operating a farm based YouTube channel: <u>Hartung Family Farms - YouTube</u>

The second tech session speaker, <u>Stuart Birrell</u>, an Associate Professor of Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering at Iowa State University, described the capabilities of the <u>Off-Highway Vehicle Chassis</u> <u>Dynamometer Laboratory</u>.
